Do you have a friend who would love to join in on the Girl Scout fun? Now she can join and you can earn an awesome, exclusive patch. This patch program is designed to encourage Girl Scouts at all levels to share their Girl Scout experience with their friends!

To earn this patch, complete the tasks required for your level and complete the form (bit.ly/bringafriendpatch) to receive your lilypad and frog. Repeat the steps and for every additional friend you bring that registers as a Girl Scout member in our council, you earn another frog until your lilypad patch is full.

No matter what pathway your new Girl Scout friend chooses when she registers, you are eligible to earn a frog. New members pathways are:

1. Becoming a troop member
2. Enrolling as an Individual Girl Member
3. Attend a Girl Scout event
4. Attending Girl Scout Summer Camp

- Create and deliver an invitation inviting a non-Girl Scout friend or classmate to attend one of your upcoming troop meetings, a Girl Scout event, or Girl Scout Summer Camp.
- Teach her how to make the Girl Scout hand sign.
- Show her your Girl Scout uniform or a badge you have earned.
- Tell her about what you've done in Girl Scouts.

Brownies

- Create and deliver an invitation inviting a non-Girl Scout friend or classmate to attend one of your upcoming troop meetings, a Girl Scout event, or Girl Scout Summer Camp.
- Teach her the Brownie Smile or Make New Friends song.
- Show her your Girl Scout uniform or a badge you have earned.
- Tell her about what you've done in Girl Scouts.

Juniors

- Create and deliver an invitation inviting a non-Girl Scout friend or classmate to attend one of your upcoming troop meetings, a Girl Scout event, or Girl Scout Summer Camp.
- Make her a SWAP and explain what it is.
- Show her your Girl Scout uniform or a badge you have earned.
- Tell her about what you've done in Girl Scouts.

Cadettes, Seniors & Ambassadors

- Create and deliver an invitation (can be a creative virtual invitation) inviting a non-Girl Scout friend or classmate to attend one of your upcoming troop meetings, a Girl Scout event, or Girl Scout Summer Camp.
- Make her a SWAP and explain what it is.
- Show her your Girl Scout uniform or a badge you have earned.
- Explain a service project you have done as a Girl Scout for your community.
- Explain unique opportunities available to you through Girl Scouts like Counselors in Training at camp, Destinations travel, High Awards, etc.
