

## Leadership Outcomes

#### Girl Scouts are more likely than non-Girl Scouts to:



Have strong sense of self (80% vs 68%)



Have positive values (75% vs 59%)



Seek challenges and learn from setbacks (62% vs 42%)




Develop and maintain healthy relationships (60% vs 43%)



Exhibit community problem-solving skills (57% vs 28%)

#### **STEM**

#### Life Skills

#### Entrepreneurship


