

Reservations

- » Reserve your Service Unit/Troop program options on Doubleknot.
- » Initial reservation, enter 1 person and update totals 30 days prior to event.
- » Encampment coordinators are responsible for getting a certified program instructor and get a copy of their current certification to forward to the Council Encampment Coordinator encampments@girlscoutsaz.org.

Eligibility Requirements & Accommodations

All programs are structured for the age level noted in the description. To best serve girls and adults, please consider any needed accommodations for the participants.

Program Fees

Prices are per GIRL or per PARTICIPANT (Girl and Adult may participate); otherwise adults do not pay the program fee as they serve as supervision during the program. Fee type is listed under program description. All participant numbers are based on the numbers provided at the time of registration. Numbers may change up to 1 month prior to the program. Groups will be charged addition program fees not accounted for within the reservation.

Inclement Weather

Most all programs take place outdoors, rain or shine (including during the winter months). We do not cancel programs due to rain, snow, or cold. To have the best experience, participants must come prepared and dress accordingly for programs.

- **Warm Weather = temperatures average 70-100° F** – What to bring & what to wear: Water bottle, Light colored clothing, sun hat, sunscreen, close-toed shoes with socks
- **Cold Weather = temperatures average 10-40° F** – What to bring & what to wear: Water bottle, clothing layers (leggings/pants/rain pants & long-sleeve shirt/t-shirt/sweatshirt/cold weather jacket & hat & gloves) sun hat, sunscreen, waterproof close-toed shoes with socks
